Meeting called to order at 6:05 pm

Review and approval of prior meeting minutes: Minutes motioned to approve by Collette Memmott, Audrey Fish seconded, everyone in favor for minutes to be approved.

Counseling Center update: Course requests occurring soon, course requests nights January 25 for incoming 7th graders at 5 and 6. January 26 course requests for future 8 and 9 grades. Copper Hills will be completing traditional scheduling for incoming 10th graders.

Feb 14, CHHS will be going to 9th grade science classes to help students build course requests and schedules for core classes, electives will be arena scheduling in April.

Counselors are looking into the scheduling and course options from CHHS and will inform parents.

Safe Walking Route: With new homes being built the walking routes will remain the same. There will be new streets in the outlets, but crossing areas are the same. Lights on 7800 south, flashing lights in front of school, crosswalks the same. The drop/off and pick up flow and stops are the same.

District requests: Repaint directional arrows, they are faded. Repaint yellow line on sidewalk by bus zone to indicate where students stand back from curb.

Safe walking route approved and signed off by Chair, Lisa Eskesen

Crossing guards frustrated because drivers are blocking bus zone and paths for traffic during pick up.

Difficult for buses to enter and are disregarding the "no stopping/parking" signs.

Communicate with community on website and Week at a Glance. Will send out a map to remind parents of proper area to drop off/pick up students. Parents do not need to drop off students right at door, drop off anywhere on the sidewalk. Crossing guards need help with putting out cones in afternoon to block off bus zone

Digital safety concerns: Concerned about students making poor choices on phones; making sure students are not making a poor choice online and face the repercussions of police involvement. Ensuring that students do not write something on social media or texts that are harmful and/or inappropriate.

Possible solutions:

- Safety committee to communicate to community and school about digital safety; discussing apps and ways to support their children with proper usage at home and school. Mrs. Fish is looking into how other schools handle this and how to support a committee or ways to communicate with the community about digital safety.
- White ribbon week is this week—promoting appropriate internet usage and safety.
- Possibility of creating a flyer to be handed out during PCCR's (which parents attend), discuss at Back to school night, parent/teacher conferences. Course through the school about student and parent attending digital safety course.
- Students now meet with their assistant principal and have a contract for digital safety—discuss and sign. Parents are notified about consequences if behavior happens again.
- Parents/school members supporting classes to show families proper digital safety, teach how to navigate computers, apps, programs, etc.
- Netsmartz assemblies through grants in school around beginning of the year.
- TA class is teaching Second Step and digital safety—tik tok challenges, Common Sense—digital footprints.

Clubs: New clubs can be applied for in the spring, new clubs will be advertised and should have a positive purpose

2nd Quarter Event Updates:

- Christmas for kids—volunteer to shop with a high school student that needs support. Students in need were given \$110 each to buy for themselves or family.
- Fundraiser raised \$1500 dollars toward Copper Hill's Paws for a Cause. Of the total amount raised \$250 went to provide Christmas for a family in our community.
- A \$2,000 donation from the Ron McBride Foundation will provide a mindful space for adults working at the school, will include massage chairs, drinks, noise canceling headphones
- Dance Company performed and were fantastic
- New Assistant Principal Intern-Veronica Holyoke (H-M)

Data:

- 13 recovered F out of 25, some close to finishing
- Students pulled out of class to help students complete work to improve F's
- Absentee before Christmas was 253, since return from break is about 320
- Teachers were asked to record lessons or find ways in Canvas to support students who are home

COVID update: Close to meeting Test to Stay requirements. If close, the district will be contacted if numbers go to 2% positive rate. Test to stay will be conducted by Health Dept in the gym, system will be detailed when appropriate. Currently no social distancing required, no plexi glass being used, teachers using own PPE equipment. JSD board gave superintendent authorization to call remote learning day if needed.
